Disability Justice

Preference towards able-bodied + Neurotypical People in the world

- Seen to be able to produce more of a profit through labor
- Differences are a natural element of human diversity
- The difference between Able-bodied and disabled People ~~that~~ is influenced by the ways they interact with infrastructure created by able-bodied

76+77 How do climate justice + disability justice intersect?

- Disabled people are often one of the most marginalized people in our society
 - Climate change disproportionately affects marginalized communities
- ii. "Climate change ~~issues~~ highlight the areas where infrastructure and strategy are failing to meet everyone's needs."
- Ideas about individual choice can be harmful to the disabled community + also dismissive of what they can bring to discussions

C9 Capitalism

- Many people go on with their lives and forget about climate change

- forget climate change exists unless they are directly impacted by it.

- idea of capitalism - People will have many choices about what they buy + from whom.
- companies try to make as much money as possible
- compete with each other for the most customers
- Capitalism focuses on profit alone.
- more focused on money + material goods than the people
- over consumption ignores the threats of climate change they are creating.
- this creates they try to make things fast + cheap resulting in bad working conditions for workers

Racial Capitalism

- Benefits of centres of labor + slave trade that ~~allowed~~ allowed europeans to build wealth
- white families typically hold more wealth and it's hard for ~~BIPOC~~ people to catch up,

Extractive Capitalism

- extraction of natural resources + peoples labor in a way that ~~they~~ doesn't care about long-term consequences
- Shows us theft of people involved in transatlantic slave trade and theft of land that colonizers took.

Capitalist Narratives

- Anti-foraging law → Black + Indigenous people depend on White Supremacist food system
- the idea of food having to be brought in from far away came from colonizers who stripped people of their land and resources.
- supported by early police forces.
- prioritizing career over artistic expression is supporting the idea that something must make money to be worth anything
- "in order to work you need a car!"

- Undoing these Narratives can help put the people + planet first!

- "Big Oil" corporations are only interested in making a profit and not about solving the climate crisis
 - That's what they will protect
- Create accountability to individuals instead of themselves
 - ex: Saying that if you get a certain type of something (listened) ~~you are helping the climate crisis~~
 - it's actually their fault
- Spends lots of money on climate denial
 - they have known about climate change for a while
 - Putting lots of money into research and campaigns ~~into~~ into climate denial
 - Used fake experts, conspiracy theories, and cherry-picked facts to decrease support for climate action.
- 10+91
 - Seek more funding from government and making fossil fuels cheaper than renewable energy, therefore convincing more people to continue to use fossil fuels
 - Corporations try hard to have us look the other way.
 - lobbyists seek legislation that increases criminal charges for people protesting ~~against~~ against fossil-fuel infrastructure.
 - Possibility of criminal record leads to less people joining protests → less media interests
 - ↳ Corporations avoid public scrutiny → Corporations carry on as usual
 - causing relatively cheap energy in the U.S.
 - it is cheap energy for the U.S. but Natural Disasters that are destroying ~~entire~~ other countries with very low carbon emissions
 - Fossil fuel industry invests in Plastic



- Some big oil companies use their huge profits for funding the U.S. police.



- Global South affected - people migrating due to climate disasters, food insecurity & collapsing economy

El Niño Event - 2018

- over 10 million people already food insecure
- shortages in food, water, reduced rainfall
- increase in air pollutant release.
- lasted 2 years

No protection under the law

- people who leave their country due to CC don't qualify for protection under international law.
 - only applies to those who face conflict their or face persecution.

Scientist "estimate that as many as 134 million people in the US will be displaced by climate change by 2100."

C12 Resist fossil fuels - Stop Big Oil

- ④ Keep fossil fuels in the ground - "rebuild the economy in a way that achieves climate justice we must stop the bleeding, not patch up the hole."
- Big oil employing more people to find more ways to extract carbon
- ↳ "addicted to oil extraction."

New ways to extract oil

- Fracking - injects chemicals into stone/shale to extract deeply embedded oil
- Tar sands extract - 3 times as much green house gases produced
 - ↳ Intensive Mining + Steam Injections
- Threat to health, water, ecosystems

"Corporations launch huge campaigns to fool people into thinking that New fossil-fuel extraction projects are for the greater good.
It's critical to recognize this "greenwashing" and call it out!"
